I am also in the process of writing a grant to help with the feasibility of me taking a 3 month sabbatical in 2025. Food Pantry Happenings

A big thanks to all the volunteers, congregation members, and boy scouts who came on a wet and cold Saturday morning. Not the most pleasant of days weatherwise. However, the Food Pantry Volunteers were at the church early and cheerfully prepared and passed out 100 bags of groceries. Prayers were offered on behalf of all who received the groceries. As most of you know, Judy McClelland (food pantry point person for more years than I know) is moving to be near her daughter in Seattle, Washington. Thank you, Judy, for all that you have done over the years! Judy has passed the mantle tome. I would be really worried were it not for the wonderful group of volunteers who make up the heart of the food pantry. If you have never had the opportunity to serve, let me give you a brief description of all that is involved in making 100 bags of groceries possible:

-Bulk fresh produce, approximately 1,000 pounds, is ordered from Buster Lind, Produce.

-Non-perishable items-dry pinto beans, rice, canned vegetables, tomato sauce, oatmeal, fideo, and tortillas are purchased or donated monthly by members of the congregation.

-1,000 pounds of fresh chicken quarters are procured and frozen.

-On the third Thursday of the month all the non-perishables are divided and place in 100 grocery bags. -On the third Saturday, the fresh produce is delivered and added to the grocery bags along with the frozen chicken.

-The volunteers then begin the process of passing out the bags.

This month we are trying a new thing. The beans and rice that we provide will be purchased in bulk from Sam's and volunteers will meet one day to prepare 100 bags of each. On that day, we will also receive 100 ten pound bags of chicken that will need to be prepared for freezing. If all goes as planned, that day will be Monday, March 4th at 2 PM. If you feel God calling you to this ministry, please join us on one or all of these days. There is always room for another set of hands.

In selecting recipients for the El Valle District Scholarship, our goal is to honor with a scholarship award those who:

- Have been accepted into a college, university, or technical school academic program.

• Are active members of a United Methodist Church in the El Valle District for a minimum of one year prior to submitting the application. (Any member of a local congregation who has or is in the middle of disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church will not be considered.) To meet this goal, the scholarship committee will review your application based upon a whole person concept as measured by the following criteria: academic potential, faith foundation, community service, extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, and the mission of representing The United Methodist Church well at your college or university. Financial need is not a relevant criterion. Our intention is to offer multiple scholarships at a minimum of \$500. The amount will vary from year to year.
